Jakub Hort, MD, PhD, is an Associate Professor of Neurology and a director of Memory Disorders Clinic at 2nd Faculty of Medicine Charles University and Motol University Hospital of Prague, in the Czech Republic. Dr. Hort is a member of EFNS (European Federation of Neurological Societies) Scientific Panel on Dementia, as well as a chairman at the Cognitive Neurology Committee of the Czech Neurology Society. His areas of expertise and clinical and research interests are Mild Cognitive Impairment and biomarkers of Alzheimer's Disease. He has closely collaborated with the Czech Academy of Sciences on developing spatial memory tests, which can be administered in human variant of Morris Water Maze and its computerized version. Furthermore, he is a principal investigator on several research projects and an established supervisor of a research team. He has published in several peer-reviewed, international recognized journals. In 2001 he was awarded a clinical internship at Queen Square Institute of Neurology at Guy's, King's College and at St. Thomas's hospital in London (mentors: prof. Plant and prof. Kopelman) and in 2003 he was awarded a clinical internship at Memory Disorders Unit at Massachusetts General Hospital in Boston, MA (mentor: prof. Growdon). He has also collaborated with University of South Florida (prof. Andel).
